BRICK AND TILE-MAKING MACHINES.

This machine has obtained several prizes of the Royal and other Agricultural Societies, and has been awarded an

Exhibition medal. The annexed engraving shows one of these machines, the property of Mr. Henry Clayton, Atlas

Works, Dorset-square. It consists of a vertical cylinder, in which the clay is placed, and a piston with a rod, cross head, and side rods attached to two vertical racks, that are moved by two pinions on a shaft, with a cog-wheel on the end, that takes into a pinion turned by a winch handle, to which the power is applied. When the cylinder is filled with clay the piston is pressed down by the vertical racks, and squeezes the clay out through the die plate fixed to the bottom. There are two cylinders, each 18 inches diameter, attached by swing brackets, so that whilst one cylinder is at work the other is on the table at the back, being filled with clay, ready to take the place of the first described one as

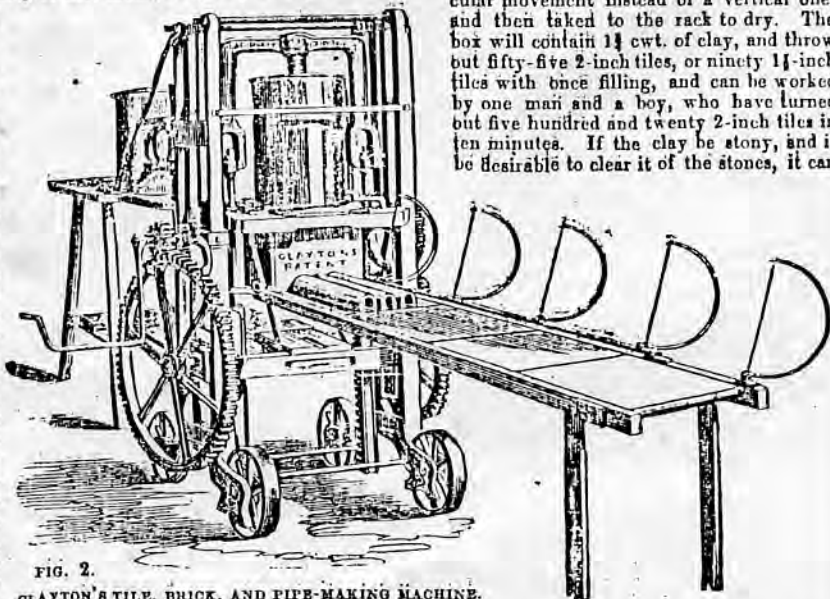

CLAYTON'S TILE, BRICK, AND PIPE-MAKING MACHINE.

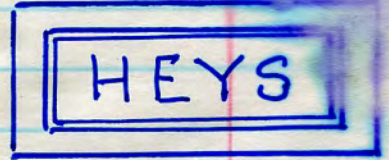
soon as it is emptied. Fig. 2 shows a similar machine, with an additional box under the cylinder, into which the clay is squeezed from the cylinder, and thence through the dies horizontally, on to the table in front. Between the bottom of the cylinder and box a perforated plate or screen can be placed, to prevent any stones passing through the dies. This machine can be worked by two men, and will produce, according to the statement of the inventor, from 10,000 to 15,000 feet of drain pipe per day. The price of a machine complete, excepting dies, is £30.

By this machine hollow bricks and Roberts' patent hollow bricks can be made with great facility, and at a very cheap rate.

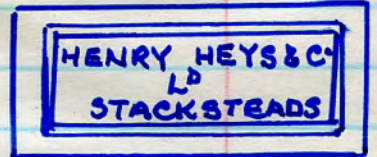
Mr. JOHN WHITEHEAD, of Preston, Lancashire, exhibits a machine for making drain pipes and hollow bricks. This new machine appears to be a very effective one, and has obtained not only the prize of the Royal Agricultural and other Societies, but also that of the Exhibition. It consists of an iron box in front to contain the clay, and within which is a piston that exactly fits the box transversely; on the back of this piston are two horizontal guides with racks, which are actuated by two pinion wheels on the axle of a 2-foot cog-wheel on the opposite side of the machine. This cog-wheel takes into a 6-inch pinion on the further end of the axle of the large wheel, and this latter is actuated by a small pinion turned by the winch handle. When the box is filled with clay, the cast-iron lid is shut down and bolted; the wheels are then set in motion, which acts upon the two racks described, and forces forward the square piston, and with it the clay in front, and squeezes it through the die-plates of the form required; on to a table in front covered with an endless cloth passing over rollers, and there the tubes are cut into lengths of about 12 or 18 inches by wires having a circular movement instead of a vertical one, and then taken to the rack to dry. The box will contain 1½ cwt. of clay, and throw out fifty-five 2-inch tiles, or ninety 1½-inch tiles with one filling, and can be worked by one man and a boy, who have turned but five hundred and twenty 2-inch tiles in ten minutes. If the clay be stony, and it be desirable to clear it of the stones, it can
